## **Background**

The Telebit family (T2500 and Worldblazer) modems used on Quanterra, Inc. systems for many years are now out of production. These modems were selected originally because of their ability to handle efficient transfers using the kermit protocol to Unix hosts. Telebit's current products no longer support kermit protocol "spoofing", and so offer no advantage less expensive recent alternatives.

## **US Robotics 56000bps X2 modems**

A new modem configuration file "cm\_usr56k" has been developed that permits use of new advanced 56kbps US Robotics "Sportster" modems with "X2" technology.

## **Limitations**

Although the USR modems are capable of transfer rates up to 56000 bps, the standard /s1b serial ports on Q680 systems are capable only of DTE transfer rates of 19200 bps because of the high capacitance of the stringent surge protection. Special modifications that may permit operation at higher DTE rates are under investigation. Most international telephone circuits, however, rarely permit modem-to-modem rates exceeding 19200 bps.

The /t2 and /t3 ports on Q4120 systems have lower-capacitance surge protection, and will operate up to 38400 baud DTE rates.

## Installation

The modem configuration files are stored on disk in the directory */h0/SHEAR/TMON* in a system running SHEAR 34/02-R1231 (earlier versions of SHEAR will not support the USR56k) or in directory */h0/USHEAR/TMON* in a system equipped with UltraSHEAR. At system startup, the secondary *startup* file in the directory appropriate for the hardware configuration family (such as */h0/USHEAR/CFG/Q80/DV*, */h0/USHEAR/CFG/Q80/LV*, */h0/USHEAR/CFG/Q80/LX*, or */h0/USHEAR/CFG/Q80/4120* - see the sections entitled Understanding the Configuration, Software Configuration, and Configuration directory organization in the Operation manual for your system) copies one of the files named, for example, *cm\_telebit*, to a working copy, called *config\_modem*, on the ram disk, */r0*. These lines may appear something like:

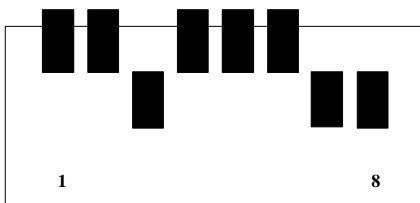

The new configuration for the USR56k should be placed into the appropriate directory where your modem configuration is stored now in a file called *cm\_usr56k*. The contents of this file are attached. After creating this file, modify the appropriate startup file to make the working copy at boot time:
